Share your story What's one thing in your garage or storage area that's been around too long and needs to go? What's something there that needs to be "re-commissioned" and brought back into use? (7-10 min) 3. Read Joshua 24:15. 4. Discuss these questions with your group. (20-45 min)

	But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord. (Joshua 24:15)
