

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| | Behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask continuous, and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the ointment. (Luke: 37-38). |
| | What was the woman crying about? What were her tears and actions expressing (without words)? |
| | Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner." (vs. 39) |
| | Why do you think the Pharisee wasn't taking Jesus seriously? What eventually changed his mind? |
| | Therefore I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven—for she loved much. But he who is forgiven little, loves little." (vs. 47) |
| | How was the Pharisee missing the "big picture" about where he stood wit God? Why did the woman have a crystal clear picture of her deep need fo Jesus' mercy? |
