

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. Open with prayer. (2-5 min)

2. Share your story: What's the biggest thing for which you ever asked and then received it? What was your motive in asking? Tell us that story. (7-10 min)

- 3. Read Matthew 7:7-11.
- 4. Discuss these questions with your group. (20-45 min)

"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. (Matthew 7:7-8)

What is significant about the order of Ask, Seek, Knock?

Does it represent some sort of progression in the possible fulfillment of our prayers?

Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him! (Matthew 7:9-10)

What qualifies as a "good thing" when it comes to the requests we make of God?

Pastor Kim used to say, "When entreating God for something, always ask yourself: "Am I willing to make this request in the name of Jesus?" How could that be helpful to us when it comes to knowing what's a "good thing" according to Matthew 7:10?
