

	believed a thing about you that wasn't true. What was your emotional
	response to that discovery? (7-10 min)
	3. Read Luke 19:41-44.
	4. Discuss these questions with your group. (20-45 min)
	When [Jesus] drew near and saw the city, he wept over it, saying, "Would
	that you, even you, had known on this day the things that make for peace.
	But now they are hidden from your eyes. (Luke 19:41-42)
	Have you ever withheld the whole truth from someone because you were
	concerned with what he or she would do with the information?
	If so, how did you make that decision?
	Why does God keep some things a mystery? How does that motivate some
	people to seek out the truth?
	Have you ever been tempted by a representation of Jesus you knew
	wasn't accurate? Explain.
	What are some "counterfeit-versions" of Jesus that people buy into today?
	How will they eventually be disappointed?
