AIRLINE SECURITY

PROOF OF US CITIZENSHIP, PASSPORT, VISA & MINOR CHILDREN REQUIREMENTS

Minors traveling with either one parent or no parents must have a certified letter of permission from the parent or parents who is/are not traveling. This letter must be presented at airport check-in. All international tours require a current passport. Entrance to Israel requires your passport be valid for 6 months after your return date. Your passport number must be recorded by a Pilgrim Tours agent when making your reservation. Names on airline tickets must appear as shown on passport. Photocopies are not acceptable forms of identification. Non U.S. Citizens are responsible to fulfill appropriate entry requirements of the destination countries. 12 Day Inspirational Tour | June 23-July 4, 2021

Wednesday, June 23: Depart USA

Depart from Denver today for the flight to Tel Aviv.

Thursday, June 24: Arrive Tel Aviv / Jaffa

Arrive in Tel Aviv late this afternoon. Enjoy a walking tour of Old Town Jaffa. Jaffa is where Peter had his vision of the white sheet containing all manner of animals while stay¬ing in the home of Simon the Tanner. Dinner and overnight is at the Seasons Hotel in Netanya.

Friday, June 25: Western Coastal Region

Begin the day with a visit to Caesarea Maritima, this Roman harbor city was built by Herod the Great. View the remains of the aqueduct, hippodrome, and theatre. Continue north to Mt. Carmel to the area where Elijah confronted the prophets of Baal. Descend into the valley of Jezreel to Megiddo, known for its his¬torical, theological and geographical importance, and especially as it is also known by its Greek name Armageddon. View of the Sea of Galilee from Tiberias road. Dinner and overnight will be at Nof Ginosar Hotel.

Saturday, June 26: Nazareth

This morning we visit the Church in Cana This is the area where Jesus performed His first miracle. Continue to Nazareth to visit Mary's Well, the Church of the Annuncia¬tion and Mount Precipice. Visit Nazareth Village, a recreation of a first century village for a glimpse into the past. Next stop at the Magdala excavations, this is the town of Mary Magdalene. Return to Nof Ginosar for dinner and overnight.

Sunday, June 27: Northern Galilee

After breakfast go to the Yigal Alon "Jesus Boat" Museum to see the remains of a first century fishing vessel found in the ex¬posed lakebed during a severe drought in the 80s. Next, enjoy a ride in a boat on the Sea of Galilee modeled after the first century vessels. This is a refreshing time for contemplation. Arrive at Capernaum and see a first century synagogue and the remains of the home of Peter's mother-inlaw. Continue to the Mount of Beatitudes where Jesus preached His message on the Kingdom of God. Walk downhill to the Church of the Loaves and Fishes in Tabgha and also visit the Church of St. Peter's Primacy which marks the location of Peter's reinstatement as an apostle follow-ing his denial of Christ in Jerusalem. Drive to Banias and enjoy a short hike through some lovely vegetation to the area of pagan worship. Banias was the area where Jesus and his disciples were when Christ asked, "Who do men say that I am?" Return to Nof Ginosar for dinner and overnight.

Monday, June 28: Southern Galilee

Drive to Beth Shean which played an important role in history being located at the juncture of the Jordan and Jezreel Valleys. The walls of this Philistine city bore the bodies of King Saul and his sons upon their defeat by the Philistines. Continue to the area of Shechem to see Jacob's Well, a site much revered by Jews, Muslims and Christians. Enter the church built over the site and see water drawn from this ancient well. Drive into the West Bank to visit Shiloh which was the worship centerand location of the tabernacle before the temple construction in Jerusalem. Continue to Jericho to see the tel of this ancient city and hear about its destruction by the Israelites as they blew on their trumpets. At the end of the afternoon, stop at Qasr Al-Yahud which is believed to be the site of the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist, indeed, Bethany-Beyond-the -Jordan is just across the river in Jordan. There will be opportunity for those who wish to be baptized in the Jordan River to do so at this time. Continue on to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight at the Ambassador Hotel.

Tuesday, June 29: Bethlehem / lerusalem

Depart Jerusalem this morning heading towards Bethlehem and see the area of the Shepherds' Fields on the way. Once there,



visit the Church of Nativity which has been undergoing restorations to reveal beautiful mosaic artwork on the walls of the church. There will be adequate time for shopping in Bethlehem for olive wood souvenirs. Return to Je¬rusalem to the Mount of Olives and visit the Church of Ascension. See the Church of Pater Noster where one will see the Lord's Prayer in over 100 languages. Follow the Palm Sunday route of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Visit the Church of Domi¬nus Flevit (the Lord weeps) for a view of the city. Continue to the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed with His disciples. See the Church of All Nations which enshrines the rock said to be where Christ knelt in prayer the night of His arrest. Return to the Ambassador for dinner and overnight.

Wednesday, June 30: Dead Sea

Head south toward the Dead Sea to visit the desert palace/ stronghold of Herod the Great. Masada was also the last holdout of the Jewish Zealots in their revolt against Rome. Remains of the Roman siege encampment can still be seen. Hike through the oasis of En Gedi to the waterfalls. This is one of the areas where David would hide from King Saul. Continue to the beach for a swim in the Dead Sea where the mineral content is so high it is impos¬sible to sink! Stop at Qumran to learn about the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls found in the caves. Return to the Ambassador Hotel for dinner and overnight.

Thursday, July 1: Jerusalem

This morning begins in the Jewish Quarter with a visit to the Wohl Archaeologi¬cal Museum, this excavated complex preserves a 385-foot section of the Upper City near the Temple Mount dating back 2,000


years. See the Cardo, the main thorough-fare during ancient times. Visit the Western Wall, which is assuredly part of the original retaining wall of the temple mount. Learn about the Western Wall Tunnel and see original foundation stones. Con¬tinue to the Shrine of the Book where some of the Dead Sea Scrolls are on display. Next, visit the Model of Jerusalem, a scale model of the city of Jerusalem as imagined about 70 AD. This is followed by a somber visit to Yad Vashem, the Jewish memorial to the Holocaust. Return to the Ambassador Hotel for dinner and overnight.

Friday, July 2: Jerusalem

Our day begins with a trip up to the Temple Mount where the Al-Agsa Mosque and Dome of the Rock are located. Visit theDavidson Exhibition located next to the Dung Gate, it is a wonderful exhibition with rich archaeological content. Climb the Southern steps which we can be sure that Jesus and His disciples climbed. Continue to the City of David and visit the Pool of Siloam and Warren's Shaft (which discovered the underground water system). Visit the church of St. Peter in Gallicantu which marks the location of Peter's denial of Christ. Continue to the Up¬per Room built over the location where Jesus and His disciples met for the last supper. Stop to see the remains of the Pools of Bethesda where Jesus healed the paralytic man. Next door is St. Anne's Church known for its amazing acoustics. Travel the Via Dolorosa making several stops along the way and end at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Return to the Ambassador Hotel for dinner and overnight.

Saturday, July 3: Jerusalem

Enjoy some free time today to revisit some of your favorite sites or to shop on your



own. Gather together at the Garden Tomb for a brief tour and a time to celebrate communion. A special farewell dinner is planned at the Ambassador Hotel this evening. Overnight at the Ambassador

Sunday, July 4: Return to USA

Transfer to Ben Gurion Airport, Tel Aviv this morning for the return flight home. Arrive in Denver later today.
